### What is RSVP?

The Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) recruits and offers volunteers meaningful ways to respond to critical community needs.

RSVP is sponsored by Pima Council on Aging, the Area Agency on Aging for Pima County's older citizens.

RSVP in Pima County is the only Senior Corps program in Arizona that has continued under the same local sponsor, PCOA, since its inception in 1973.

The RSVP of Pima County Service Area reaches across Tucson, Green Valley, Marana, Catalina and Ajo.

Senior Corps is a national program that connects more than 500,000 Americans to service opportunities with nonprofits, the faith-based and other community organizations throughout the U.S.

RSVP connects individuals 55 years and over with rewarding service opportunities that enrich the lives of volunteers.

Volunteer talents, skills and availability are matched with the people and organizations that need the most. Activities include mentoring students, children, and the homeless; homeland security/disaster preparedness; literacy, education enrichment; and care giving.
